BMI (Body Mass Index) is calculated by dividing the body mass in kilograms by the body height in meters squared (there are many charts to save you having to make this calculation yourself).

A BMI between 18 and 25 is considered healthy; anything under 18 is underweight, over 25 is overweight and over 30 is obese.

Be aware that some people may fall outside the normal range and still be healthy, for example a power



athlete carrying a lot of muscle may have a Bivil over 25 and still be perfectly healthy.
